Wills & Trusts

Giving to Tarkio College through your will or living trust is often referred to as a "bequest." A bequest from your estate may include cash, securities, real estate, and/or personal property. It can be for a specific amount or for a percentage of your estate.

How Do You Make a Bequest to Tarkio College?

If you are writing your will or living trust, you will need to include specific language that correctly identifies your support of Tarkio College. If you already have a will, you can add a codicil or amendment to your existing estate plan. Or, if you already have a living trust, you would simply modify the language, directing your trustee to make the desired distributions.

Sample Bequest Language: – for College-determined purposes – for a purpose you define

Informing Tarkio College of your gift does not obligate you or your estate in any way; it simply helps the College fully understand your gift intentions and ensures that there is a plan in place for implementing them. For example, if you would like to endow a scholarship, the Office of the President can assist you in establishing the terms of that scholarship. Additionally, it allows the College to thank you appropriately. Of course, it is understood that you may change your bequest at any time.

Death of Board Member Emeritus, Marnie Shaum 1922 – 2014 — Tarkio, Missouri

Marilyn Katherine Shaum (always known as Marnie), the daughter of Paul C. Ambler and Katherine Norris Ambler, was born on March 10, 1922 in Shenandoah, Iowa. Her father, the long-time Mayor of Shenandoah, was a partner in a corn and bluegrass seed business. Her mother was a librarian at the Shenandoah Public Library. Marnie graduated from Shenandoah High School in 1939 and then went to Columbia, Missouri where she was a freshman at Columbia College. The following year she worked at the City National Bank in Shenandoah before moving to New York City where she worked at the Life Magazine News Bureau for the duration of World War II.

While living in New York, Marnie met James B. Shaum of Tarkio who was serving in the US Navy at the time. The couple married in New York in December 1944. After the war the couple moved to Philadelphia where Jim completed his Master's Degree at the University of Pennsylvania Wharton School and Marnie worked at the McKee and Albright Advertising Agency. After graduation, Jim accepted a job as Business Manager of Tarkio College, and the couple moved to Tarkio. Over the next 7 years they became the parents of three children, Blaine, Paul and Betsy. In 1960 Marnie decided to complete her college degree and graduated from Tarkio College in 1964. She continued to pursue

graduate studies in English Literature at Northwest Missouri State and the University of Nebraska.

Marnie was very active in the community. She was a member of P.E.O. Chapter FF and a past President. She was a member of the Shenandoah Study Club and the American Association of University Women where she served as a President of the local chapter. She was a member of the Atchison County Republican Women, was President in 1980 and 1981, and attended the Republican National Convention as a delegate. She was a member of the Mule Barn Theater Guild where she served as President and Editor of the Newsletter. She served on the Development Council of the Fairfax Community Hospital. She was active in the Atchison County Historical Society and was instrumental in establishing the Atchison County Historical Society Museum in Tarkio. She served on the Tarkio College Alumni Board. She was a member of the United Presbyterian Church where she served on the Session and as President of the Women's Association. She was active in Community Betterment and received the Citizen of the Year award in 1981. Marnie passed away peacefully in her home in Tarkio on July 19, 2014 surrounded by her family.

Her family designated TCAA to receive memorials.

Letter From the President of Tarkio College

Alums, Friends and Supporters

The Tarkio College Board of Directors has made the bold move to secure certification as an institution of higher education from the State of Missouri. This is the first step in reacquiring full status as an accredited college. We have completed the application requirements, with the help of our education consultant, and look forward to the scheduling of visits by the Department of Higher Education. The process is time consuming and the work extensive, but in the end we will once again "Set Fire"!

In addition to the professional continuing education programs, which are scheduled to begin this year, Tarkio College is planning to offer an Associate Degree in Science (A.S.) in Public Service, with three areas of specialization: Public Administration, Health Care Management and Public Safety. Classes will be offered at the beginning of the first semester after securing certification from the State of Missouri. The process of offering a two year academic degree requires certification by the State of Missouri and, eventually, accreditation by a national accreditation organization. Other offerings are under consideration, but will not be decided upon until after a major survey of the regions high schools has been conducted by Tarkio College. Plans had been made for a major symposium which would have brought, at least, 50 school districts together to discuss the higher education needs of students in rural

communities. It became evident that a high level of participation was going to be difficult to achieve due to diverse schedules at each district. To overcome this obstacle and achieve the goal of a high level of input the Board of Directors directed the President and the educational consultant to conduct an extensive survey of educational needs directly with the superintendent and guidance counselor of each of the school districts, at their school and on their schedule. In this manner the Board anticipates the standardized information gathered will be in greater depth. Once the data is compiled and analyzed, decisions will be made on the degree offerings to be added to the catalog.

These are exciting times for Tarkio College. A cadre of loyal and dedicated alums have worked together to: reactivate the corporation, establish a mission and purpose, reapply for charitable status with the IRS, apply for certification as an academic institution with the State of Missouri, build and implement a professional continuing education program, resurrect and refurbish Rankin Hall, and research and secure funds from estates, trusts and foundations. Join us! Become an active member of the Tarkio College Alumni Association and become a part of the future for Tarkio College.
